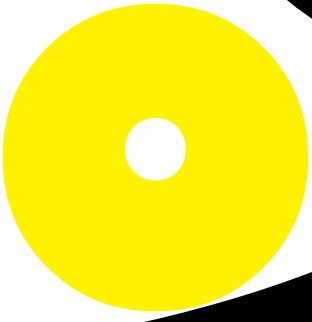
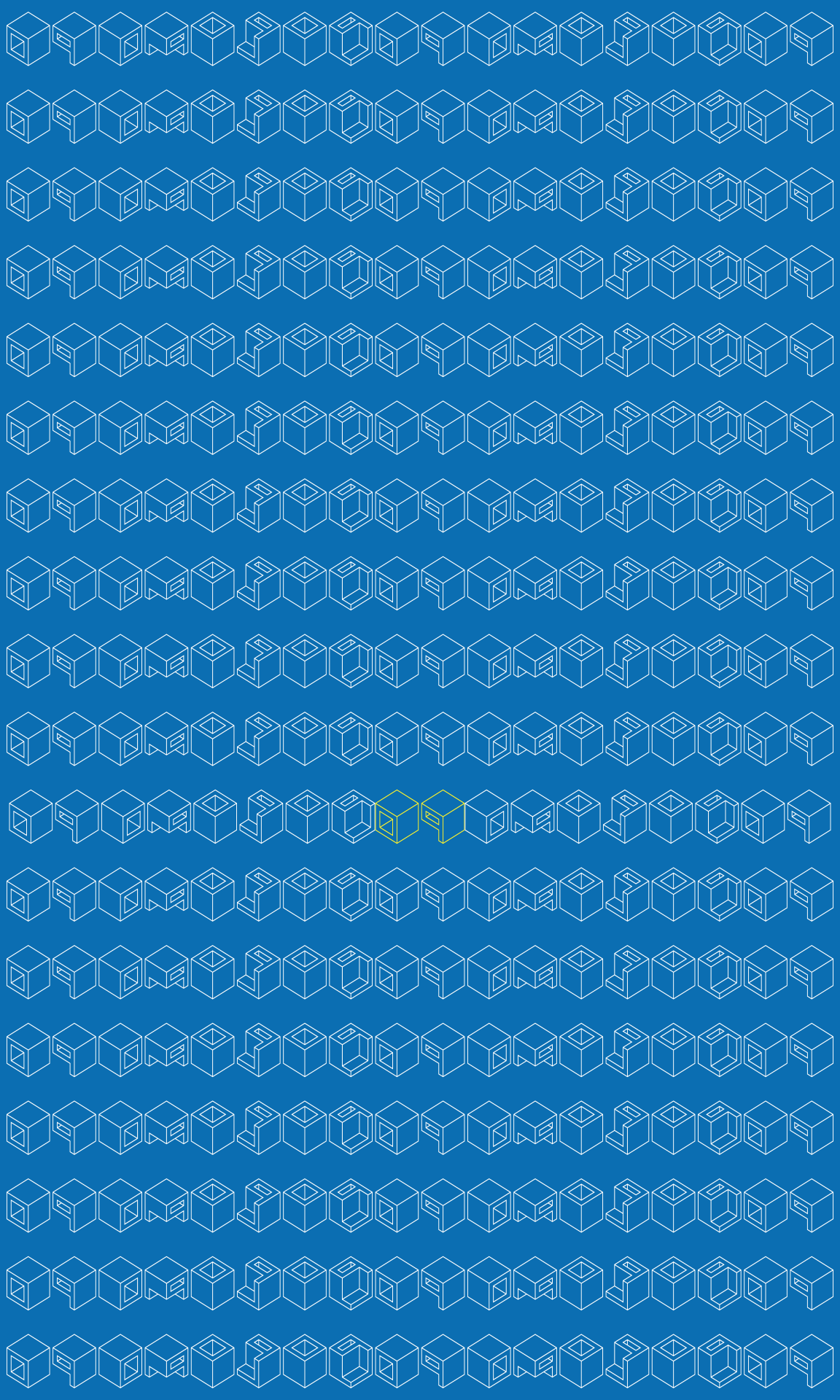

enrollment & registration

UCLA Summer Sessions enrollment is open to everyone, including college students, high school students entering grades 10-12, and adult learners. The diverse Summer Sessions population includes continuing UCLA students, visiting students from other American and international universities, motivated high school students, and professionals continuing their education.

ONLINE REGISTRATION

UCLA students enroll directly through URSA (University Records System Access) beginning February 2, 2009 and non-UCLA students enroll online at www.summer.ucla.edu beginning March 2, 2009.

New non-UCLA students who use the online registration form receive a UCLA student ID number that they will use to create a UCLA logon. Once you have your ID number, go to URSA (www.ursa.ucla.edu) and follow the instructions there.

You will be required to submit a \$100 non-refundable deposit (\$400 for international students) by credit card before a UCLA student ID is issued. International students receive their student IDs in an e-mail or through their registration center.

Once you create your UCLA logon you can also use URSA to enroll in your courses and make changes to your program.

Returning non-UCLA students or former UCLA applicants who already have a UCLA ID number may use URSA to enroll. Be sure to update your address, phone number, and e-mail if necessary. If you have questions about UCLA logons, please visit www.bol.ucla.edu.

REQUISITES

Some courses have prerequisites. If you are a UCLA student, URSA will automatically check to see if you have met the requirements. If you are not a UCLA student, please make sure that you have experience comparable to the listed prerequisites. There is no need to submit transcripts. If you are uncertain about the level of difficulty of a certain course, please check the UCLA general catalog (www.registrar.ucla.edu/catalog).

TRANSFERRING UCLA UNITS

All UCLA summer credit transfers automatically to other UCs and the grades are automatically included in your GPA.

UCLA courses are generally accepted for transfer credit at other colleges and universities although visiting students are advised to get approval from their home university. Transfer of credit is at the discretion of the receiving institution.

ADMISSION TO UCLA

Registration in Summer Sessions does not constitute admission to UCLA. If you would like to apply to UCLA, you should do so through Undergraduate Admissions and Relations with Schools (www.admissions.ucla.edu) or Graduate Admissions (www.gdnet.ucla.edu).

FACULTY

Our summer courses are taught by regular UCLA faculty members and outstanding visiting faculty who are invited for the special expertise and academic perspectives they offer the campus community.

HOUSING

Living on campus at UCLA has many advantages for Summer Sessions students. The University provides comfortably furnished residence halls and residential suites within easy walking distance of classrooms, libraries, and recreational facilities. Housing is available for six-, eight-, nine-, ten-, and twelve-week periods. Most students find that living on campus is a convenient and enjoyable option during Summer Sessions.

For students who prefer the independence of living off campus, there are the University Apartments which are located within easy walking distance of the campus.

MEAL PLANS

Students who live in University housing can choose among several meal plans. The food in the dining halls is considered to be very good.

PARKING

Parking is assigned on a space-available basis for an additional charge. Payment is due upon receipt of the parking pass and residents can only purchase parking contracts equal to the length of their enrollment in Summer Sessions.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA STUDENTS

UC students pay a \$59 campus fee plus course fees. These fees apply to all continuing UC students, including students admitted for fall 2009. UC students who drop all courses prior to the beginning of class must pay a \$100 nonrefundable processing fee. All fees are subject to change by action of the UC Regents.

NON-UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA STUDENTS

Non-UC students pay a \$300 registration fee plus course fees. \$100 of the registration fee is nonrefundable. The fee covers both sessions. It reserves a space for you in the classes you

choose and gives you access to campus services and facilities. The registration fee for international students is \$700 of which \$400 is nonrefundable.

INSTRUCTIONAL ENHANCEMENT INITIATIVE

All students are charged an Instructional Enhancement Initiative (IEI) fee of \$6 per unit for College of Letters and Science classes and \$7 per unit for School of Engineering and Applied Science courses. Independent study courses are not subject to this fee. The fee funds the maintenance of course Web sites and provides enhanced computer laboratories with expanded hours of access.

GRADE REPORTS & TRANSCRIPTS

You can use URSA to see your grades two weeks after the session ends.

Most classes are offered for letter grades with a pass/no pass option. You may use URSA to change your grading option within certain deadlines.

The transcript is a permanent record that reflects all work completed at UCLA. It lists courses, units, grades, grade-point average, transfer credits, and work in progress.

You can order a transcript on URSA. There is a fee for each transcript; additional fees apply for transcripts requiring special delivery services. Students with Billing and Receivables (BAR) accounts can charge transcript orders to these accounts.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students can register for UCLA Summer Sessions through one of our registration centers where staff members can assist in selecting classes, reserving on-campus housing, and obtaining health insurance. Please refer to our list of registration centers.

If you are an international student and want to register directly with UCLA Summer Sessions, you can register online at www.summer.ucla.edu.

All international students must submit additional information to us, including the International Student Supplemental Form available on our Web site.

Most students will need an F-1 visa to pursue summer study at UCLA. Details about the visa process are available on our Web site. Our office will assist you with the necessary paperwork.

The visa process takes several weeks, so if you plan to study in Session A, please register online before May 15, 2009, and if you plan to study in Session C, before June 19, 2009.

did you know?

- Over 2000 UCLA students study abroad every year and almost 6000 international students come to study at UCLA.
- There are more than 40 languages taught at UCLA.
- Korea is the country that sends the greatest number of students to UCLA; China is second.

UCLA opens its doors to motivated high school students in the summertime. They study with world-renowned faculty and highly successful peers and they experience campus life at one of the most prestigious U.S. universities. UCLA Summer Experience offers the best possible preparation for later academic and professional success.

Acting and Performance Institute

A comprehensive six-week program designed for students interested in pursuing theater in college and beyond.

Mock Trial

An exploration of the U.S. legal system that gives participants a chance to explore careers in law, build self-confidence, and strengthen communication skills through participation in mock trial presentations.

Art Institute

An intensive studio art program where students choose from one of four disciplines: painting and drawing, photography, sculpture, and video art and new genres.

Art | Science Lab

A two-week program designed for high school juniors and seniors interested in collaborating with diverse and notable minds to challenge traditional polarized thinking of the arts and sciences.

Chamber Music Institute

An innovative program for advanced musicians focused on collaborative performance. The institute broadens and nurtures musicianship, inspires creativity, and develops strong communication and leadership skills.

World Music Summer Institute

An opportunity to study African-American, Korean, Mexican, or Brazilian music with a master artist. Musicians will also experience these fine examples of L.A.'s musical culture through off-campus fieldtrips.

Dance-Theater Intensive

Daily movement classes in a variety of traditions ranging from postmodern dance to Brazilian capoeira. The program also includes sessions on art and social engagement.

College-Level Courses

High-achieving high school students who are entering grades 10-12 in fall 2009 are invited to enroll in regular, lower-division UCLA classes numbered 99 and below. Students earn UC credit for their work and they experience studying and learning in a university atmosphere. When deciding which course to take, high school students should consult their teachers and counselors.

Design | Media Arts Institute

Designed for students interested in exploring their creative potential by learning the most current software and working with trained arts professionals. Classes are offered in graphic, Web, and game design, as well as audio/video.

Housing

Students enrolled in high school institutes may choose a residential option which includes supervision, a meal plan, and a schedule of activities. Students aged sixteen and older who are enrolled in regular UCLA classes may choose to live in the residence halls.

special programs & institutes

ENTREPRENEURSHIP INSTITUTE

Led by UCLA Anderson School's award-winning faculty, the institute immerses students in the fundamentals of business, providing exposure to topics covered in any premier MBA program while also offering hands-on career development workshops.

SPORTS AND MEDIA MANAGEMENT

Students in this four-week intensive program learn about management and marketing challenges in the sports industry. The program is designed as an upper-division undergraduate program for students from a variety of backgrounds seeking to explore and understand the changing face of the sports business.

ENTERTAINMENT AND MEDIA MANAGEMENT

This certificate program offers students an insider's look into the rapidly changing film, television, and multimedia worlds, and includes presentations by L.A.-based executives, excursions to media companies, and career-building workshops.

LABOR AND WORKPLACE STUDIES

Participants in this Institute will immerse themselves in the Los Angeles labor movement, a national leader in efforts to promote social justice for working people. The program includes a supervised internship in a labor union or community organization.

JUMP-START: AN INTRODUCTION TO ARCHITECTURE

This six-week program serves as an introduction for students contemplating careers in architecture. Open to undergraduate students, incoming graduate students, and working professionals, the program includes courses in architectural design, graphic and digital representation, and the history of contemporary architecture.

TRAVEL STUDY

UCLA Summer Sessions offers over 50 Travel Study programs around the world. Taught by some of UCLA's most distinguished faculty, Travel Study programs allow students to explore a subject in its cultural and historical context. Programs vary from four to eight weeks and offer eight to 16 units of credit.

UCLA is often referred to as the city in the village, a reference to Westwood Village, the student-oriented neighborhood that borders the campus to the south. With over 60,000 faculty, staff, and students, one of the best hospitals in the country, a police department, dozens of coffee shops and restaurants, movie theaters, performance venues, and swimming pools, the UCLA campus offers everything you need to have a fun-filled and stimulating summer.

BRUINCARD

The BruinCard, an identification card that carries very special privileges, allows you to check out books, work out in the campus gym, and get discounts at certain stores, among many other conveniences. In addition to UCLA's well-known attractions like Royce Hall and Bruin Walk, you might want to make a special effort to visit these campus spots:

SUNSET CANYON RECREATION CENTER

Nestled into the woods on the northwestern edge of campus, Sunset Canyon has three pools,

including an Olympic-sized lap pool, a diving pool, and a large family pool. There are multiple barbecues and picnic tables, perfect for a Sunday afternoon lunch. Stretched out on one of the chaise lounges next to the pool, you'll hardly remember you're still in a major American metropolis.

BROAD ART CENTER

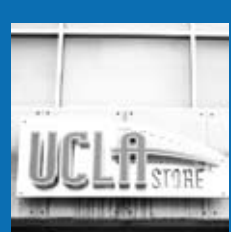
The new Broad Art Center is home to UCLA's artists and designers, so it's hardly surprising that its café serves one of the best espressos in town. Provocatively called "Untitled," the café also serves light meals accompanied by the latest indie rock.

THE HAMMER MUSEUM

Located in Westwood Village, this dynamic museum has embraced the art of Los Angeles, producing spectacular exhibits of local artists and architects. The museum also screens film classics from the collections of the UCLA Film and Television Archive, second in size and value only to the Library of Congress. THE FOWLER MUSEUM

The Fowler Museum, located in the center of campus, explores the artistic cultures of Africa, Asia, the Pacific, and the Americas. The exhibitions are organized around innovative themes such as HIV in Bengali scroll paintings or the visual griots of Mali. Combined with the aesthetic pleasure of the building, the permanent collections and temporary exhibitions are a truly delightful discovery for visitors.



los angeles



Long mythologized by films and television programs, Los Angeles is more than a city, it's a character in and of itself, an unimaginably expansive labyrinth of highways and distinctive neighborhoods. What makes Los Angeles worth exploring is its very diverse population, including huge numbers of immigrants from Iran, Korea, China, and Latin America.

Los Angeles gets better the longer you're here. It's not always easy to get to your destination but the journey itself will undoubtedly take you past a four-star restaurant beloved of the Hollywood glitterati or through a neighborhood where all the signs are in a different language.

In addition to the common tourist destinations of Rodeo Drive, Santa Monica beach, Disneyland, and Universal Studios, you might want to explore some less well-known delights.

GETTY VILLA

Reopened in 2006 after an extensive restoration, the Getty Villa is dedicated to Etruscan, Roman, and Greek art. The permanent collection is remarkable but the most spectacular sight may be the view overlooking the reflecting pool with the Pacific Ocean in the background. The Getty Center, the Villa's partner, is just a short bus ride from campus and has a full calendar of screenings, performances, and lectures. Find out more at www.getty.edu.

LACMA

The Los Angeles County of Museum of Art has extensive public programming including free jazz performances in its courtyard on Friday nights. There, you'll meet the town's sophisticates who enjoy dinner, drinks, and a wide variety of jazz groups. You'll find the calendar at www.lacma.org.

SANTA MONICA FARMERS' MARKETS

There's a growing interest in consuming locally grown food and many neighborhood farmers' markets are expanding to meet demand. Santa Monica, in particular, hosts an open-air market almost daily. The Sunday morning version located where Ocean Park Boulevard runs into the Pacific also has live entertainment and pony rides.

THE GROVE

California offers fine produce and a rich variety of ethnic foods. You can find all of this at the Farmers' Market located at Third and Fairfax just next to one of L.A.'s newest shopping centers, the Grove. This market is ideal for groups of people with different tastes. You can buy some taquitos from one stand and your friend can buy sushi from another. You sit at a table in the middle and share!

DODGER STADIUM

The Brooklyn Dodgers moved to Chavez Ravine in 1958 and became a Los Angeles institution. They've had varying levels of success as a team but have managed to maintain a consistently loyal and vocal fan base. You can check out the schedule and ticket prices at www.dodgers.com.

WILL ROGERS STATE PARK

This pastoral gem is the homestead of one of the most famous actors of the 1930s who left his land to the state of California. The park has several easy hiking trails, including one to "Inspiration Point," offering spectacular views of Santa Monica Bay, Century City, downtown L.A., and even Catalina Island. After your hike, you can relax with a picnic while watching a game of polo.

Ecology and Evolutionary Biology 116

A study of ecological and evolutionary principles as they apply to the preservation of species and ecosystem diversity.

ENVIRONMENTAL ECONOMICS

Economics M134A

An introduction to major ideas in natural resources and environmental economics, with an emphasis on designing economic incentives to protect the environment.

ENVIRONMENTALISM

Urban Planning M115

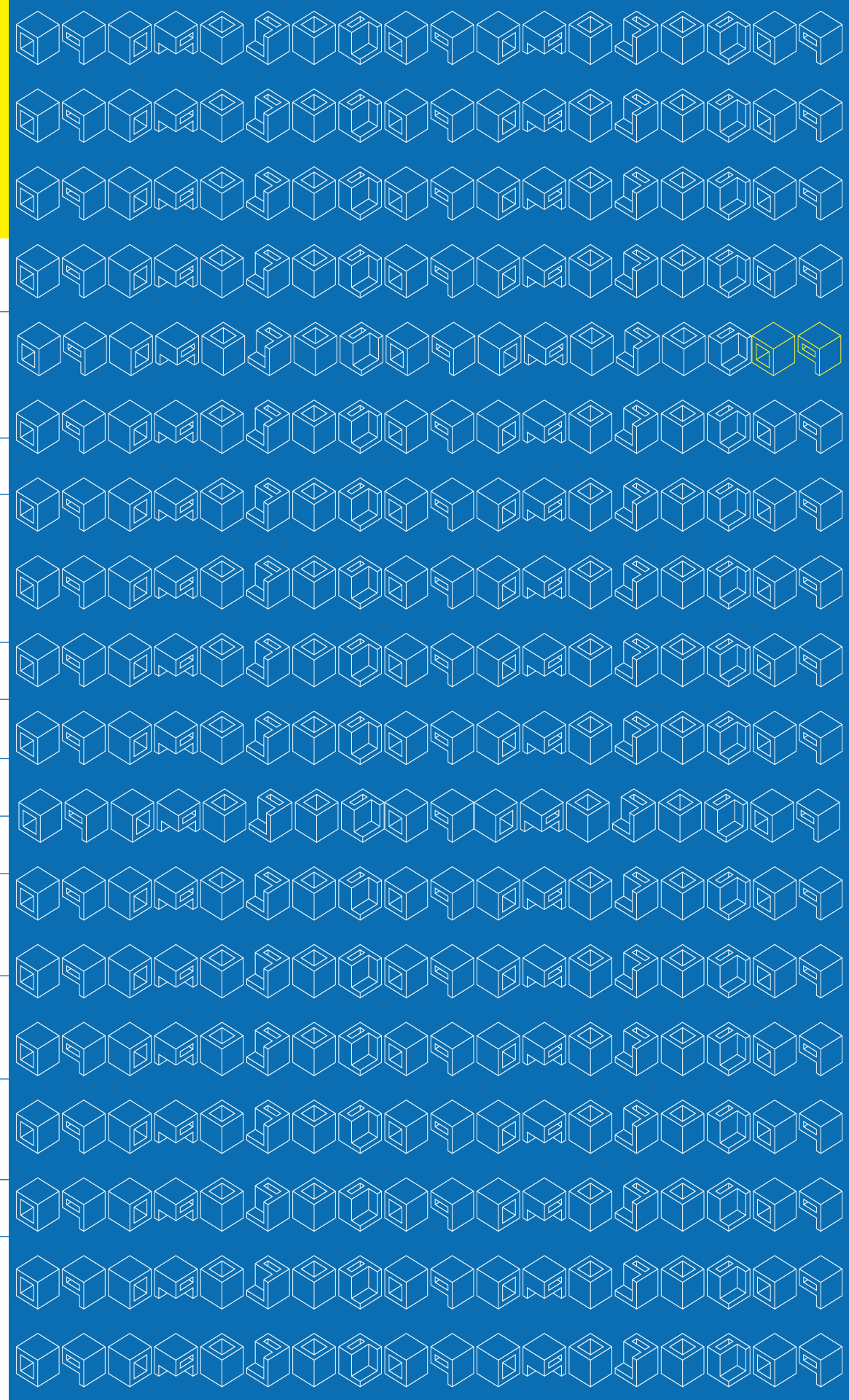

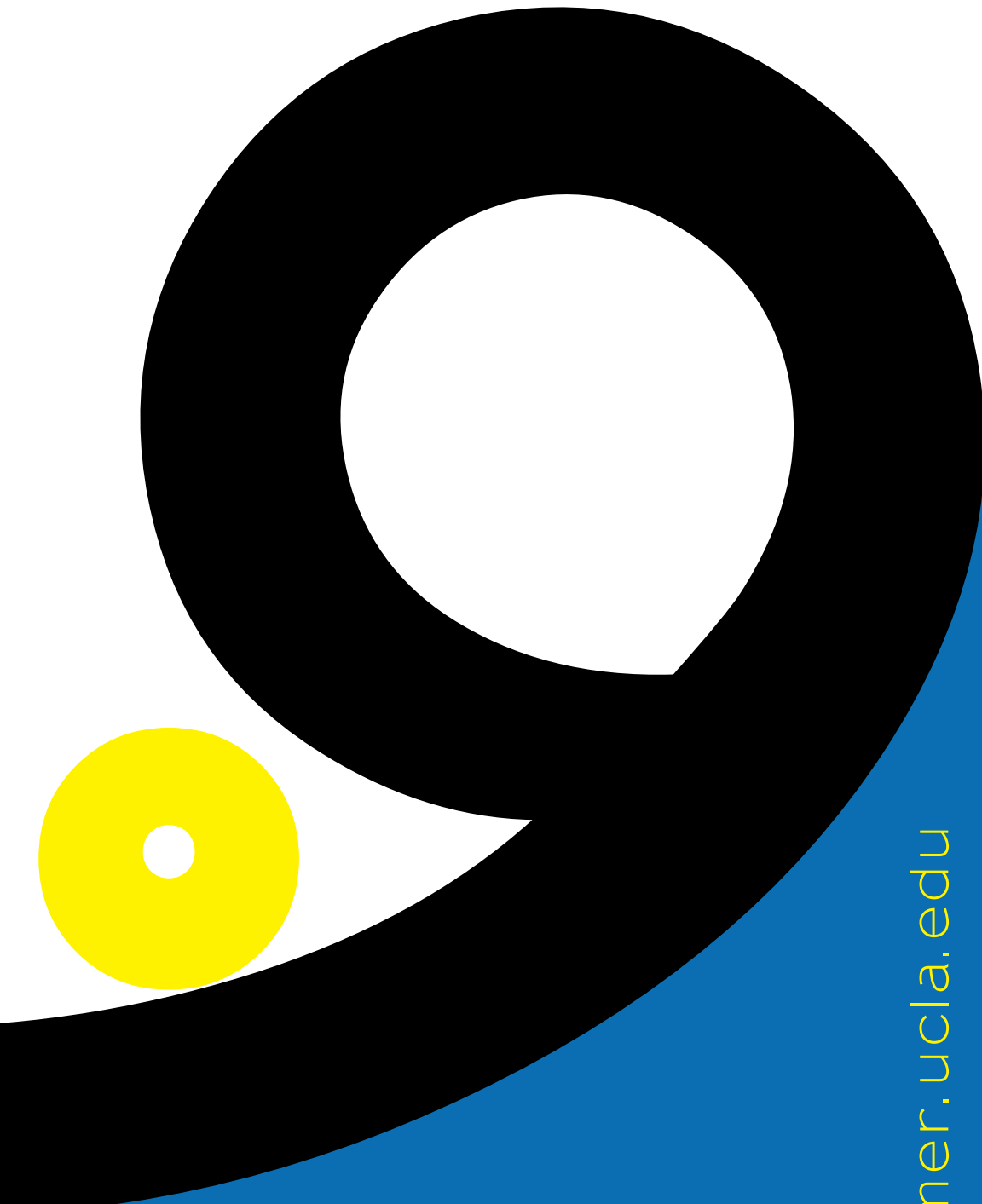
